

## Cookie Booth Etiquette Pledge

Since Cookie Booths provide an excellent opportunity to increase public awareness of the Girt Scout Organization, it is imperative that proper etiquette and behavior be displayed by everyone (girls and adults) at alt cookie booths.

- 1. Always represent GSTOP with pride, following the Girl Scout Promise and Law.
- 2. Conflict should be avoided at cookie booths. Remember, the Girl Scouts are watching and learning by everything the adults do. Troops that are involved in conflicts may be asked to leave the premises and may have future cookie booths revoked.
- 3. Adults should never leave Girl Scouts alone and should always comply with the two adults and two-four Girl Scouts at a booth location at one time. Questions? Refer to Volunteer Essentials chapters 4 and 5 at <a href="https://www.gs-top.org">www.gs-top.org</a>.
- 4. Girl Scouts should always wear a Girl Scout shirt, sash, vest, and/or membership pin while participating in a cookie booth.
- 5. If your troop is scheduled for a booth, please arrive 15 minutes before to set-up and always take down your booth at the assigned time.
- 6. Take all of your trash, including empty cookies cases. Be sure not to leave anything behind.
- 7. Don't forget to bring all of your booth decorations and sales materials.
- 8. Food and drinks should not be consumed during a booth sale nor should talking or texting on a cell phone.
- 9. "Please" and "Thank you" goes a long way, even if the customer says no to purchasing cookies.

The person in charge should have the booth sale confirmation email with them.
