

## Wild About Girl Scouts Frequently Asked Questions

**What is the Annual Meeting?** Girl Scouts of Texas Oklahoma Plains' Annual Meeting is a gathering where council members, including volunteers, staff, and girls aged 14-17, convene to conduct official business, elect board leadership, approve bylaw amendments, and hear reports on council performance. We will send out information on what will be discussed and voted on to all that want to participate prior to the meeting so you can prepare.

**What can I do if I don't register for a class, or if the class I want is full?** If the class you want is full or you don't find a class you are interested in, you can select the option "No Workshop during this block." You can use that time to visit the Fort Worth Zoo, network with council staff and volunteers, and browse the Girl Scout shop.

**What class options are available for girls who register to attend?** Girls (14-17) will have the opportunity to register for specialized girl classes during the afternoon workshop blocks. Class topics include mental health, leadership, and Highest Awards.

**Do I still have to pay the registration fee if I don't want to choose the lunch option?** The \$30 registration fee covers much more than lunch. Registration includes your ticket to the Fort Worth Zoo (typically \$22), parking, lunch and keynote speaker, as well as afternoon classes.

**Is there a discounted price, if I am a Fort Worth Zoo member?** There is not a discounted price for Fort Worth Zoo members as the registration fee covers more than just your Fort Worth Zoo ticket.

**If I register my girl, can she do the classes with me if she doesn't want to do the girl class option?** The afternoon classes, besides the designated girl track, are reserved for volunteers. If your daughter is attending the event, she will either need to register for the girl class options or use that time to explore the zoo.

**Can members from other Councils attend?** Due to the unique venue, spaces are limited. Because of this, only registered members of Girl Scouts of Texas Oklahoma Plains can register for this event.
